ORKNEY SHEEP BREEDERS ASSOCIATION RULES

- 1. Stock forward for sale must be bred by the owner, or if purchased been on the sellers holding for a minimum of six months prior to sale.
- 2. Stock must be appropriately tagged.
- 3. Stock must be presented for sale in good condition showing no major defects to legs, back, jaw or testicles.
- 4. Stock arriving at the mart with any signs of a medical condition will be vetted prior to the sale by a nominated member of O.S.B.A., and a staff member of Orkney Auction Mart. If the stock is deemed unfit for purpose, it will not be sold.
- 5. No male sheep carries a guarantee of fertility unless stated at the time of sale.
- 6. Stock must be **clearly numbered** and brought to the sale ring by the exhibitor.
- 7. All unsold stock will be returned to original pens by mart staff.
- 8. At the fall of the auctioneers' hammer, the buyer, or his/her representative, becomes responsible for the animal.
- 9. In the event of a dispute, the president of O.S.B.A. will have the final decision.
- 10. Minimum bid for 1st Sale Shearlings £200 Ram Lambs £150
